
The French House / Jacquie **Bloese**


The French House is an absorbing novel set in the island of Guernsey during the WW2 occupation. At its heart is a love story between Emile and his childhood sweetheart, Isabelle. Emile plans to go to Canada to make his fortune, but a workplace accident leaves him deaf and he returns penniless to discover Isabelle has married another. Emile must accept life losses on all fronts and marry someone else, creating a tangled web unrequited love throughout the text.


Themes tension of and sympathy continue throughout, whilst war time tensions spark gossip, rumour and tragedy amongst the township.


