Gumeracha Community Association

The Gumeracha Community Association is a small but dedicated group of volunteers who want to make a positive contribution to our beautiful town of Gumeracha. Over the years we have initiated many projects, including the Tourist Information Board and having power installed in Federation Park.

Currently our big achievement is the sets of street banners decorating the Main Street of Gumeracha. We have 6 sets of 18 banners that we raise for different events - Lest We Forget, Christmas, Australia Day, Easter, Spring and our beautiful Gumeracha banners depicting the nature of the area. The banners are very simple to install as they are on a flagtrax system. This means we can easily change over the banners with our feet firmly planted on the ground - no need for ladders, cherry pickers or traffic control.

So how do we pay for this? We make fresh apple juice. We purchased a crusher and fruit press which we use to make pure fresh apple juice and pear juice on site at local markets and sell by the cupful. We also make a hot spiced apple juice which is very popular - it tastes like apple pie in a cup! You can find us at Mount Pleasant Farmers Market every Saturday morning. We are also at the Gumeracha 5th Sunday Markets and the Medieval and Rare Trades Festival.

In addition:

- We publish a quarterly newsletter distributed to residents of Gumeracha and surrounding areas.
- The Gumeracha Soldiers Memorial Hospital needs some outdoor seating, so we are funding two sets of tables and chairs so that patients and their visitors can enjoy fresh outdoor air in comfort.

Cherry, Date & Walnut Roll

- | | |
|-----------------------------|------------------------------------|
| 1/2 up finely chopped dates | 1/2 tsp bicarb of soda |
| 2 tblsp currants | 1/2 cup chopped walnuts |
| 1/3 cup water | 1/4 cup chopped glace cherries |
| 1/3 cup soft brown sugar | 1/2 tsp ground nutmeg |
| 40g butter | 1 egg, lightly beaten |
| | 3/4 cup self-raising flour, sifted |

Preheat oven to 180°C. Brush a roll tin (4-cup capacity) with melted butter or oil. Line side with greaseproof paper.

Place dates, currants, water, sugar and butter in small pan and stir over a low heat for 5 mins or until butter has melted and mixture boils. Remove pan from heat and let it cool slightly. Add bicarb soda to pan; stir.

Place walnuts, cherries, nutmeg, egg, cooling date mixture and flour into a large bowl. Stir until combined.

Spoon mixture into prepared tin; close open end of tin with lid. Lay tin on its side in oven, bake 45 minutes. Leave cake in tin for 15 mins before transferring to wire rack to cool.

Note: Can most likely cook in a log tin if you don't have a roll tin!

Yummy cut into slices and buttered or spread with cream cheese!

South Vietnam Service Memorial

The names of eight young men, listed as born in Gumeracha, along with others from South Australia, are honoured on a new War Memorial Plaque prepared for the feature wall of the Gumeracha Returned Services League room in the Gumeracha Civic Centre.

This follows from the very successful Anzac Dawn Service in April this year and the recent Remembrance Day Dinner in November - events honouring the 50th anniversary of the commitment.

Research of records available from the National War Memorial Canberra was undertaken by members of the RSL and the Gumeracha History Centre. The Memorial Plaque designed and made by "Sign Craft Co" of Lobethal.

The Plaque and others may be viewed in the RSL room and is nearly always open.

A list of the eight Gumeracha men and also the full list from South Australia will be compiled and made available as a take-away memento.
