



Mystery Wines at Lyndoch

The Lyndoch Hotel's Red Room Restaurant was the venue for the Bruce Thiele Red Wine Club's monthly dinner and wine showcasing.

On arrival members and guests enjoyed a welcome wine and finger food. Welcome wine was a 2019 Cooper Burns Rosé to go with the hot and cold roaming finger food from the Red Room Kitchen. Delicious finger food was the popular vote.

So too was the welcome wine which was, as usual subject to the members looking glass. Judged to be a little darker than the usual salmon pink of Rosé the wine had a soft well balanced palate with good fruit. As is their nature Club members just have to check to see if the prestigious wine writers get it right. Huon Hooke gave it 95

points. The Club's verdict was -- Yes Huon's 95 points is on target.

The Club's Newsletter Editor Ian Cooper was Wine Showcasing Presenter for the night. He presided over a Mystery Red Wine Challenge. The challenge was to identify the mystery wine. After much huffing and puffing member correctly identified the mystery wine as varietal Grenache. A show of some good wine knowledge combined with a bit of wine ineptitude.

So what did the Club learn on the night about identifying a Grenache varietal? The answer coming from the tables was it is a matter cherry, raspberry, strawberry and plum and maybe a bit of pepper on the palate.

For the Club's main course Thea, the Red Room Chef, had personally hand made massive beef schnitzels. Yes massive. They went over the edges of the plates. Served with a very tasty whiskey gravy, crispy chips and fresh salads.

Dessert was a Club favourite of sticky date pudding and cream

with a tipple of Port from the Club's own 200 ltr. barrel. Custodian of the Club's barrel is Tina Kies from Kies Winery in Lyndoch.

LVNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

For its History Month activity on Tuesday 16th May the Historical Society has chosen to provide Lyndoch's involvement with the Vintage Festival over the past 75 years. There will be a photographic display of the many floats and queens representing Lyndoch over the years in the meeting room at the rear of the Lyndoch Library from 11 a.m. until 4 p.m.



The Society was made aware of this photograph of the 1st Lyndoch Scout Group participating in a camp held at Tanunda during the 1930s. The formation of this early group was the result of the effort of Scout Master, Rev Cedric Noon (Anglican Minister at Lyndoch 1927 – 1938) assisted by David Kennedy.

In May 1935 the Lyndoch Scouts organised the lighting of a bon fire on Trial Hill. The boys were delighted in the joining of a chain of beacon fires throughout the Empire to mark the celebration of 25 years' reign by His Majesty King George; and they were likewise impressed with the ceremony associated burning. The blaze could be seen for miles around. Visitors from the neighbouring towns joined in the ceremony, and the night was made gay by the singing of songs to the accompaniment of a concertina. The National Anthem concluded this loyal effort.

Rev Noon was also responsible for the carob trees along the road side. He propagated them and had the school children plant them on various Arbor Days. For the June 1937

occasion, he organised for 40 Carob Trees to be planted along [Tanunda Road completing an avenue of trees from Lyndoch to the Church of England Rectory. This was to provide shade for congregation members walking from Lyndoch township to church.
