



LYNDOCH HISTORICAL SOCIETY

The last meeting for the year will be celebrating Lyndoch's Naming Day on 13th December at 6.00 p.m. in the Lyndoch Library Meeting Room. The topic will be the early history of the Jacob siblings, William, John and Ann, who settled at Moorooroo Ann Jacob's Diary Extract (1840 Bushrangers)

- Jan 27 Capt Truman of the Police and Mr Edwards called in the afternoon to tell us 3 Bushrangers were in the neighbourhood and would most probably come to rob us.
 - 28 Prepared for the Bushrangers in the evening expecting them every instant but they were prevented by William, Mr Morphett and Mr Rowlands passing close to them on horseback coming to this house at about ½ past eight, about nine Capt Truman came and continued two hours looking for the men but in vain could only see their fires
 - 29 The three left us for an excursion round this part of the country (a Man sent into town with an order for more Police)
 - 30 Dray left for town with Sands and his Wife, Capt Truman and three Policemen to sleep.
 - 31 William, Mr Morphett & Rowlands returned to dine. Capt Truman came in the evening with his three men
- Feb 1 All but two Police who were left to guard the Station left for Adelaide, two others being left at Capt Halls
 - 4 The two men from Capt Halls came to remain here.
 - 6 Dray returned with William's Party and Mrs Sands 2 Bushmen taken by police to Halls
 - 7 Made the last cheeses, 2 bullocks killed, William here
 - 8 The Police men recalled







Ann Horrocks (nee Jacob)

LYNDOCH EVAPORATOR

The October 'Grapevine' included information supplied by the Lyndoch Historical Society regarding the Lyndoch Evaporator that existed during the 1920s. Kies family owned the property during the Great Depression. Several follow up inquiries were received.

The building no longer exists as it was demolished. Its location was on Lot 13 Lyndoch South, on Gilbert Street between John Street and the CFS Station. It was part of the District Council of Barossa's Storage Depot area. Residents took their empty bottles and newspapers there for recycling.

The Society has a photograph of staff who worked there. Some persons not known perhaps identification will become available.




