Men's Shed-ding Or the origins of The Mt Pleasant Gentleman's Club Inc...

Following the discussion surrounding Doug Johnson's bequest of a leather lounge suite and unanimous agreement of Les Fisher's proposal to revamp the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed, work went into top gear. Brian Marr volunteered to re-draw the plans. With a makeover worthy of Renovation Rescue the kitchen/meeting room, the focal point of the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed is transformed. John Bowd and Barry Liddicoat have created a cocktail bar with polished wood panelling, gaming tables, piped music, a large flat screen TV, Hartley's subdued lighting and chandeliers; and hey presto, the Mount Pleasant Gentlemen's Club is born.

We had not intended to cater for large numbers, however, an intimate dining area is now on Brian's plans and Bill Bartsch's gourmet cocktail sausages with homemade chutney are assured to be a hit. Another barbie aficionado Roger Trudgen has stepped up and intends to diversify the menu soon – maybe saveloys with sauerkraut

In the revised plan, Brian has conspired with Peter the plumber to transform the workshop area into a men's only gymnasium with modern exercise equipment, a sauna, spa, lap pool, tanning beds, massage rooms, a hot tub, a warm towels cabinet to dry off after the excesses and a back up defibrillator. WH&S rep. Bob Long will be busy ensuring that the members don't over extend their capabilities while encouraging others to do more.

The first aid room adjacent to the cocktail bar and with ready access to the gym and massage rooms, can be quickly converted into a trainee A&E department. Fitted with the latest medical equipment the operating theatre will counter any emergency and ensure that the health of all members is maintained at a high level – a Gentlemen's Club WH&S priority.

Bill Bartsch, Roger Trudgen, Murray Henderson and Rod Howie have formed a gymnastics team and will compete in the 2017 Australian Masters Games in Tassie late October. Barry Mills OBE will complement the team as trainer and reserve.



Personal trainers and masseurs will be contracted to ensure the healthy lifestyle that members are seeking will be fulfilled and more. John Bowd's experience as a hooker, while playing rugby in NSW State of Origin, was voted 'best on ground' and is now profiled as a mentor to aspiring members.

The original plans did not include the fit-out of our kitchen/meeting room (now cocktail bar), as we had decided to make do with appliances and cupboards scavenged from some of the demolitions that we had taken on. However, as our build progressed and with Brian's advocacy, we decided to bite the bullet and strive to purchase quality appliances to complement the excellent work that our tradesmen have delivered. Now that progression has escalated to a higher quality of appliances, built-in fridges, beer on tap, blenders and European cocktail accessories including an Italian espresso machine.

At the request of Jim Gall, a distillery has been factored into Brian's re-design that will deliver a range of spirits for the cocktail bar while providing an outlet for some of the creative minds among our members who still need to blow off some steam. President Colin and Jim are putting together a selection of our high-end spirits to enter in the 2018 Mount Pleasant Show. Great results are expected.

Brian has been asked to consider plans should we decide to extend the building, even to a second storey, to accommodate relaxation rooms for members who may need a rest. A lift would be provided for those who may have over extended themselves working out in the gymnasium or too much steam in the sauna, again a Bob Long WH&S priority. OBE's George Harrison, Barry Mills and Ian Gray have indicated that, after a workout in the gym and an hour-or-so in the sauna followed by a massage, they would probably need a lie down.

Above is the latest photo of our Shed, now a mecca for



those local retirees seeking a new lifestyle, a bourgeoisie Xanadu in Mount Pleasant. Who would have guessed that, behind this suburban façade, there would be a place of relaxation for men in our community who need to 'get away' from the hubbub of daily life? It is expected that the membership will grow as legendary stories of members' escapades and decadence seep into the community.

Men's Sheds across the country are rebranding as Gentlemen's Clubs, Rotary and Lions are considering joining the movement, Wally Birch is seeking reciprocal membership benefits for the Mount Pleasant RSL and the Premier has asked if a country cabinet meeting can be held in the cocktail bar.

Hospitality employment in the state is booming, prospective masseurs and personal trainers are lining up at TAFE seeking qualifications, 457 visa applications are out of control, Les Fisher is on an international speaking tour and Yvonne Jameson is preparing a proposal to accelerate the Mount Pleasant Women's Exercise Group to compete in the 2018 AFLW.

Then Les shook me awake – I had fallen asleep on Doug's luxurious leather lounge.

John Pohl, who was on the tour with us, took us on a drive past his former family property where we could see the pug and pine residence that had been his grandparents' home before making our way to the former home of Leith Royal at Sanderston, now known as *Glen Roy*, via Cambrai.



Our hosts were Jan and Bill Broughton and we enjoyed a hearty, warming lunch before Bill told of their contacts with the Royal family, who still enjoy visiting the old property.
