
and Tonto rounding up the rustlers.)

The colouring competition is in the planning stages and we will be trialling a slightly different tack this year.


We are very lucky to not only have some very experienced voices in our group, but also some newer ones and this is bringing many different ideas and points of view to our discussions.

So, even though the hard working catering crew who have brought you the dinners every other time won't be behind the counter, you are assured of having a great meal provided by local caterers.


