Time Capsule Launch

This won't come as a surprise to those in the know, but they certainly do things a little differently and entertainingly in Mount Pleasant. Normally and ordinarily, time capsules are 'buried'. However, to celebrate it's 175 years as a town, the Mount Pleasant Farmers Market decided to launch the specially constructed, rocket shaped capsule to a height where it will remain in orbit for all to see over the next 25 years. The time capsule will hover high in the Mount Pleasant Wisteria Atrium until splashdown in 2043.

To celebrate the countdown and lift-off, a special launch lunch was held in the Wisteria Atrium following the Farmers Market on Saturday 16 June.

MC Genevieve Hebart, Manager Mount Pleasant Farmers Market, welcomed visitors to the ceremony, acknowledged the traditional owners of the land, The Peramangk people, and paid respects to their Elders both past and present.

Genevieve introduced Hon. Stephan Knoll, Minister for Transport, Infrastructure and Local Government and Minister for Planning as well as special guest Brian Pym, former Chairman of the Mount Pleasant Council, who had been asked to officially "launch" the time capsule rocket!

The Barossa Council was represented in force by Mayor Bob Sloan and Robin Sloan, Deputy Mayor Michael (Bim) Lange and Councillor David de Vries. With the Mayo by-election in full swing, candidates, Rebekha Sharkie, Georgina Downer and Major Sumner were keen space watchers. Rebekha has been a regular visitor to, and supporter of various projects in Mount Pleasant.

Around the country, while state governments are vying for the business opportunity to host the headquarters of Australia's new space agency, Mount Pleasant is ahead of the

game with the launch of the time capsule.

Many facts and discoveries in our solar system and further out in space, have been interestingly explained by astronomer Professor Brian Cox, and others like him, and with Terese Stephens at the helm, the Mount Pleasant Farmers Market has joined the Space Race. Together with local historian, Paula Bartsch, over the last 6 months, the history of our town has been collated and sealed in the capsule to be opened in 2043. Local businesses, sporting clubs, the Primary School, Kindy, Hospital, CFS, Farmers Market, Top of the Torrens, CWA and the Red Cross just to name a few, have all provided items from the past and present to be encapsulated in the time capsule.

As a lead up to the launch, special guest Hon. Stephan Knoll, a long term supporter of Mount Pleasant, left a transport conference in Adelaide to attend the launch. Stephan spoke of his association with Mount Pleasant and the Farmers Market and believes that his involvement in the launch and the experience gained will augur well in our state's bid for space supremacy.

Before starting the launch countdown, Brian Pym spoke of the long history of his family involvement in local council. His great grandfather was elected to the Tungkillo Council in 1883. Mt Pleasant was originally included within the Tungkillo Council boundary. Brian was elected to Council in 1957, the rural areas wanted someone elected from the local Primary Producers Association, a very strong group in those times, to represent local farmers and the rural industry. He was an elected member of the Mt Pleasant Council as it was then, and held this position for 36 years. During that time, he was the chairman for 16 years and vice-chairman for 20 years. He was also a representative on the State executive of the Local Government Association. Additionally, he was also an energetic player for Mount Pleasant in football. Brian retired from Council in 1993 and still lives on his family property at Rockleigh.

Powered by the well wishes of the Mount Pleasant community, Brian started the countdown and history was made. The time capsule roared and soared into the Atrium's lofty space and then very quickly returned to the launch pad to be securely stationed on its own historic 'high' for the next 25 years.

Sponsored by the Mount Pleasant Farmers Market and crafted by the skilful, surgical hands of John Bowd, carpenter, architect and Men's Shed treasurer, the time capsule has blasted Mount Pleasant's history into the future.



One thing you can be sure of is that, in 2043, the residents of Mount Pleasant will not have to scratch their heads and spend time searching for the time capsule as usually happens when a history pod is to be exhumed. The Mount Pleasant Time Capsule is in place, and there for all amateur astronomers and other visitors to see as they search the universe around the Mount Pleasant Showgrounds.

A Mentally Healthy Shed is a Happy Shed

Every month seems to celebrate some type of 'International Day'. This month, June, had *International Fish and Chips Day*! What? - I don't believe it!

'What next?' I hear you say? Well, what about *International Gourmet Burgers Day*, or *International French Onion Soup Day*? Well they DO occur - 28th May was *International Hamburger Day* and 12th January was *International French Onion Soup Day*!

Our stalwart, Les Fisher, reckons that *International Metal Detecting Day*, recognised on 20th May each year is 'spot on' and, furthermore, there should also be an International Car Boot Sale, or Garage Sale, Trash and Treasure or Swap Meet. Whatever it is, one can bet that Les will be there. Although, I suppose *International Recycling Day* on 2nd May could just about cover all of those suggested by Les.

Then, one can celebrate International Women's Day on 8th March and International Men's Day on 19th November.

However, all this pre-amble is leading to the subject of **International Men's Health Week**, 11th -18th June. Men's Health is primarily what the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed is all about. There is no doubt that making bread boards for the missus, possum boxes for the RSPCA, wicking beds for the 2018 SA Spring Garden Festival or some weaving frames for the ladies in the Mount Pleasant Day Centre is all good for morale; however, the underlying emphasis and boost is for Men's Health.

Heart Foundation
Walking



After the Grand Opening of the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed back in February, to coincide with International Men's Health Week, in June, two of our members, Bob Long and Murray Henderson kicked off our Men's Health programme with an introduction to a ramped up activity associated with the Heart Foundation ...

On Wednesday 13th June, Murray and Bob co-presented a Men's Health workshop. What had been discussed for weeks past was officially confirmed and whole-heartedly endorsed. Murray opened the workshop, speaking on both the benefits of walking and the essentials when exercising. The benefits, of course, speak for themselves with the indisputable resulting improvement in health. The

essentials, Murray determined, would be more related to longer walks; however, as with all innovations it is best to start early, taking small steps into one's stride. Walkers should ensure that they wear strong shoes, preferably boots, socks to protect your feet, clothing to suit the expected weather, suitable headwear and sun protective cream. It is also very important to carry a supply of water. Murray demonstrated with his bladder to the amusement of the group.

The meeting then plunged into chaos when Bob rose to his feet and stripped off his coat to reveal a Victorian VFL State Jersey while constricted by a harness similar to the restrictive 'cilice', or 'mortification of the flesh' as worn by members of Opus Dei (reference *The Da Vinci Code*). When the pandemonium died down, Bob spoke on the importance of exercise with the whole of the body, including the lungs with breathing and singing. Bob also revealed that his 'cilice' was, in fact, an expanding harness to draw the shoulders back. Les Fisher tried it out and determined that the harness was 'wearable'. Apart from being an inaugural member of the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed, Bob is also a second tenor in the Lobethal Choir, so is able to hold a note.



Following the workshop, a regular Walking Group was formed to meet on Monday and Wednesday mornings, rallying at the Mount Pleasant oval pavilion at 8.00am, starting with a short series of warm-up exercises, followed by a couple of turns around the oval. The walk will finish with some cooling down moves, a bit of a discussion about the next group walk before setting off to our own devices ... until the next walk.



After the first week, the numbers have swelled to 10, if you include Rusty, Hartley's dog. The walking photographer is out of the picture, behind the camera.

In the following weeks, the distance may be increased to a couple of kilometres - or, whatever suits the group. The goal of 'Walking for Your Health' is to maintain the regular walking days of Monday and Wednesday, then maybe

increase to 3 days a week. Once the walking group is settled, some regular walks around Mount Pleasant over different distances may be explored ... perhaps including a walk from the Men's Shed to 'The Olives' and back, culminating in a tea break prepared by our Walk Organisers.



Murray and Bob have suggested that we take advantage of our Prime Minister's initiative to 'Walk a Million Steps', a Heart Foundation program to get people off their couches and out walking. "Walking for an average of 30 minutes a day can lower the risk of heart disease, stroke, and diabetes by a third," according to Prime Minister Turnbull said, adding, "I encourage all Australians to join us and start with a few steps, because those few can quickly turn into one million, and a much healthier, more active future for us all." Well, people, we have started with those few steps and now we are looking for challenges. Roger Trudgen would like to take on the Kokoda Track; however, Hartley Ramm reckons the Sandakan Death March trek may be more in keeping with the Mount Pleasant summit walk. John Bowd has already done the Kilimanjaro Trek and the Everest Base Camp climb; Murray, John and Don Barrett strode around Kangaroo island for five days and, even closer to home, George Harrison and Barrie Mills walk back to their residences from the hotel every Friday night. So it can be done.

So, what is next on the agenda of the Mount Pleasant Walking Group? You could well be surprised, but will have to wait for the next exciting episode of *Walking for Health in Mount Pleasant*. In the meantime, be aware that if you walk behind a car you will become - exhausted! Step outside - and join the Mount Pleasant Walking Group. For further information:

5 WEIGHT-BEARING EXERCISES you can do right now.

1 SQUAT
Stand with feet slightly wider than shoulder-width apart. Bend or hinge 30 to 40 degrees at the hips, shifting them back and down as you bend your knees. Lower yourself to a comfortable position. Your knees should not extend past your toes. Push through your heels to return to the starting position. Repeat 10 times.

2 SINGLE LEG STANDING WITH SUPPORT
Stand with feet shoulder-width apart. Bend one knee slightly and slowly lift that leg 3 to 6 inches off the floor. Hold for 10 seconds before returning your foot to the floor. Repeat 10 times for each leg. Challenge move: Lift your leg higher, so your thigh is parallel to the floor.

3 SIT TO STAND
Stand with a sturdy chair behind you, knees just in front of the seat. Bend at the knees and hips, slowly lowering yourself to a sitting position. Pause, then stand up. Use a chair with arms for extra support. Repeat 10 times.

4 STEP UP
Stand in front of a low step with feet shoulder-width apart. Place one foot firmly on the step. Push through the heel, bringing the other foot onto the step. Slowly return one foot to the ground, then the other. Repeat 10 times for each leg. Challenge move: Use a higher step.

5 FORWARD LUNGE
Stand with feet shoulder-width apart. Lift one foot and step forward, planting your foot firmly on the ground. Slowly shift your weight onto your front foot, lowering your body to a comfortable position. Return to the starting position. Repeat 10 times for each leg.
