HELP STAMP OUT FIREBUGS THIS SUMMER

WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

- People acting unusually, or wearing unusual clothing. For example, not dressed for a trail walk, looking nervous.
- If something or someone makes you stop and wonder what's going on. Try and remember their age, sex, weight, height, hair colour or clothing.
- A vehicle or driver that looks out of place; take note of registration number, make, model, colour and any distinguishing features (such as dents, stickers).
- Some arsonists practice with small fires before igniting a larger one, so if you see signs of burnt out spot fires or anything suspicious then call police on 131 444.

WHO AND WHEN TO CALL:

- Suspicious behaviour currently happening: call Police on 131 444.
- Information about deliberately lit fires: call Crime Stoppers on 1800 333 000 or report online at crimestopperssa.com.au
- If you see a fire, call 000 for fire services.

History



The Mt Pleasant District Historical Research Group are always adding to the collection which is contained at the Soldiers' Memorial Hall and appreciate any donations, or opportunities to copy photos or documents which will add to the history of the district and the families who settled here. With a heritage that began with settlers arriving in 1843, our history is a very early one in the settlement of South

Australia.

Mount Pleasant is surrounded by townships which have a strong German influence, but with an Anglican Church and a Presbyterian Church, ours has a very different atmosphere.

Englishman, James Phillis, settled here in 1843, and visited England in 1854, returning to Australia in 1855 with 29 family members, who all settled in this region.

Another Englishman, Henry Giles also settled here in 1843, and began his influence with creating industry and work for settlers to the district.

By 1860 it was deemed that there were 1,000 residents in the area, and many shops and businesses supplied the district with the necessities of life. Today the township is reputed to be that number, but the lifestyle of today is quite different with the need to venture elsewhere today, for banking, shopping and work.

We are also privileged to have as part of **Open Doors**, an exhibition of artwork by local artist **Graham Westwood**. (see above left)

During, **Open Doors** between the hours of **1 and 4pm** each day from 27th to 29th April tours will be conducted of this beautiful art deco inspired Hall, as well as the former Police Station and Melrose House (old Elders building).

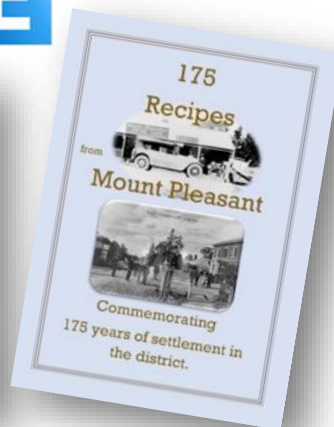
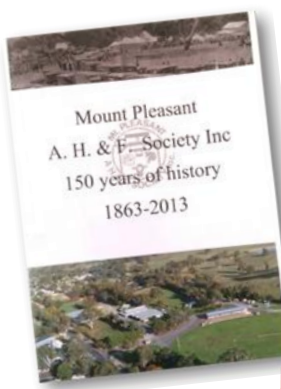

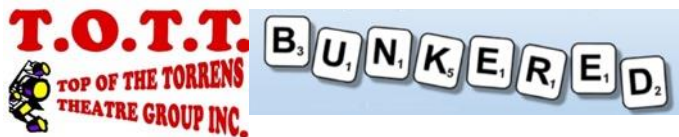
Pete's Poem

BE CONNECTED!

IT sessions in the Men's Shed on Monday mornings have been going swimmingly, with a good range of topics discussed and problem-solved.

As these are informal sessions, and we cater for a wide range of abilities, people may opt in or out as it suits. The first session was a sort of introduction to your computer, with Paul describing hierarchies and how a computer works, while the second session was an introduction to Apps, amongst other things. The next was information about when to upgrade your computer, and a few salient lessons on not leaving upgrading until your computer is crying out for more space or several dozen upgrades behind. As Murray found out, this can result in gigabytes of upgrades needed – which will really put a dent in your downloads!

We also discussed online purchasing and keeping safe – what software to look out for, and what not to open! We'll continue with online purchasing in the next session, and depending on time, will go on to hobbies and researching.

It's been really informative, and even though I am helping Paul and Gareth deliver the lessons, it's been a great learning experience for me on the more 'technical' aspects. The men and women who are coming along range in experience from complete novice, to those who sort of know what they are doing, but who may benefit from some technical or practical advice. Don't forget, this is a free service – part of the government's 'Be Connected' initiative, and we'd really like to help – even if it's only to show you how to download photos from your phone! And it doesn't matter whether you are a Mac or Windows user, iPad, tablet, Samsung or iPhone – we'll try and have an answer for you.

A person's risk of skin cancer can increase with these following factors:

- A family member who has had a malignant melanoma.
- (Mother, Brother, Sister or Grandparents)
- Five or more moles (not freckles) on your forearms.
- Previously had moles removed that were not cancers
- Previously had skin cancer
- A mole or freckle, which is changing, size, colour or shape
- Fair skin that always burns rather than tans
- Had blistering sunburn as a child enough to stay off school
- Any inflamed skin sores that do not heal

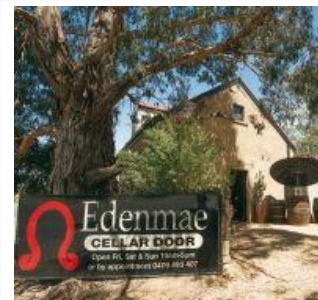
