

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History

2012 interest was shown in the development of a Mount Pleasant Men's Shed, instigated by Bob Long; a place where people, but men in particular, could meet and socialise, and with an equipped shed, be able to conduct a hobby such as wood-working.

Barossa Council has now agreed to the site at Old Talunga Park, adjacent to the Bowling Club and Tennis/Netball Clubs. Work has been carried out at this site, clearing vegetation and assessing just what the site can offer, and it has now had fill put in place ready for consolidation over the winter period.

The men involved are keen and energetic and have been raising funds ready for the building of a shed and provision of equipment, in order to have a regular meeting place.

In the process of planning a shed they have dismantled two, harvested forest timber and milled over 3,000 metres of timber into suitable sizing to build their 21m x 12m shed. Their aim was to have in place a slab at Old Talunga Park within the 2014-2015 year, ready for the construction of a large shed for future use by the community, however the wheels of bureaucracy slowly. They have continued fundraising, whilst continuing discussions with Barossa Council with regard to their support, in a similar manner to the support given to the Barossa Men's Shed at Tanunda (which the council

supported with \$23,000 in funding). Barossa Council has now agreed to support funding of \$23,000 for the Mount Pleasant Men's Shed Inc. The knowledge from within the group is vast, and there is always an answer found to any question that arises.

Fundraising...

They made excellent sales of cut wood as firewood – good hardwood – in 2014, and have continued this venture in 2015.

They have carried out jobs for the Kindergarten and private residents, whilst working for the community collecting donations at the Farmers Market gate, and conducting a stall at the Mount Pleasant Show and the Christmas Street Party.

They have carried out restoration work at Rockleigh School, funded by the Mid-Murray Council, and this continued to end of June 2015. The second stage of the work at Rockleigh School project is now complete, at least for the actual school building, and it is hoped that this will have good community use in the future.

The group is more than willing to consider any job... nothing too big or too small.

100 years ago...

The Mount Barker Courier and Onkaparinga and Gumeracha Advertiser (SA: 1880 - 1954) **Friday 8 October 1915** p 3

Mr. Mark Talbot, carrier, of Mount Pleasant, had the misfortune to seriously damage his motor lorry last Wednesday afternoon. He was driving with a full load up the Teatree Gully Hill, a steep incline between Houghton and Teatree ully, when the engine stopped, and when Mr. Talbot applied the brakes they failed. The lorry commenced to descend the hill, backwards, with great rapidity, and it is hard to imagine a more awkward predicament, for a deep gully on one side meant certain death if the lorry were to dash through the fence, and a high bank was the alternative on the other side of the road, while to steer the machine backwards down the long winding hill at such a speed was impossible. After a hundred yards had been traversed Mr. Talbot selected the bank of a cutting for a stopping place and ran the motor into this, with disastrous results to the machine, which was so badly smashed that Mr. Talbot fears that it will not be serviceable again. The driver was not injured but he received a severe shaking. Mr. Talbot is a capable and careful driver, and sympathy is expressed on all sides with

District World War I soldiers





My name is Madison Halford and I am currently completing year 12 at Birdwood High. My mother decided to breed one of our racehorses to a small Quarter Horse Stallion, expecting something small for me to move on to. In 2013 the morning of our first event together, Delilah landed on my knee and managed to hyperextend it, breaking it. So much for that idea! Later on that year when I was able to start riding we started competing and won our 3rd event. Every year after that, we placed or won every event. We only started competing 2 years ago and every year all we've ever heard from the people surrounding us is that we'll never get anywhere and that Delilah's not built right,

she'll never score well or go up the grades! Despite all that we have won one event and placed in almost every other and we're now leaving all those naysayers behind us. Delilah and I were jumping 1 star together at a training day and it was the greatest feeling in the world to know that I got Delilah there all on my own! My biggest dream besides competing in the Olympics, is to one day ride Delilah at the Adelaide International doing 2 star! Even if we can't make it there at least I know I did the best I could, dreaming big.

This year we were selected to represent both South Australia, and Birdwood High as a part of the South Australian Interschool Team, at the event which will be held in Sydney from the 25th of September, to the 3rd of October.
