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Enough

The last few months have been pretty tempestuous., and as the Federal Government staggers from one misstep to the next, I wonder when it will end.

On Monday 15th March, thousands of women and their supporters marched to protest. We were protesting about the lack of respect shown to women, the misogyny and violence, the lack of equality – even in 2021.

I did some research and found a university site that listed ‘women’s issues’ over the last hundred and forty years – and the list is long. It seems that power is released in drips. Starting with women forming unions to campaign for basic rights, through the suffragette movement – to gain the vote – raising the age of consent from 13 to 16, accessing the Pill, lifting the marriage bar in the public service (previously women had to leave work upon marriage). The early seventies were a golden age for woman’s rights, with equal pay, equal minimum pay, maternity leave, childcare reforms, single mothers’ benefits, women’s refuges, no fault divorces, etc. all being legislated, established or enacted.

There were long periods when it seems nothing happened, and even now, some attitudes are still found wanting. There is a lot that is happening in the public forum and being written and spoken about in print and electronic media, all we would ask that instead of using phrases like ‘she asked for it’, ‘she was drunk’ or ‘if she dresses like that, what else did she expect?’. It is disrespecting over half of those women who have experienced sexual assault who were just going about their daily business – who might have been wearing a uniform, who never took drugs or weren’t drinking. You are also saying that the other half of the population are so lacking in self-control that someone else must protect them from having to make the decision NOT to rape. That they are unable to understand consent, and they don’t know right from wrong.

Sexual assault is not about sex – it is about power.

Respect one another, and we won’t be having conversations about whether or not we understand what consent means. Stop using those demeaning phrases. Stop shaming those who speak out. Speak to others and you will find that there are many untold stories or heartbreak, shame and mental anguish. Believe people when they disclose those memories they would rather forget. Support them – don’t make it worse. And above all – be kind.

Business arising/ongoing:

- The Show office is still under construction. Should be useable for the Show on 20 March but may not be lined by then.
- Still awaiting formal feedback re the lift proposal in the Hall from the Barossa Council.
- The pamphlet development project grant application has been submitted and approved. Wendy has contacted 4 graphic artists and one has been selected. Once a draft is ready, Wendy will recall the working party.
- Hall hiring fees ISQ – awaiting TBC fees review outcomes.
- Genevieve sent an email to the Mayor regarding the cost of use of the pavilion for the Community dinner, seeking a waiver of fees given the amount of money from these dinners reinvested into the pavilion and for the community. Awaiting decision from TBC.
- There has been no further action on the proposed rebuild of the information bay.
- There has been no further action of the issue of firefighting equipment at Talunga Park.
- Still no further action on the Management Plan.
- The plaque re tree donations has been finalised and can now be installed following the removal of the large pine trees. John and Wendy (and other interested parties) to meet to discuss locations.
- There has been contact with a council representative re the drainage at the front of the Show Hall and Atrium. The works have been costed. Awaiting allocation of funds.
- Last meeting Gareth expressed concern about the train at Talunga Park and the fact that it should be checked regularly for hazards. This will be addressed by the Men's Shed.

Finances:

MP Progress Inc. has \$9,001.42.

The Community Dinner has \$10,366.43.

SALA has \$814.42.

The 'Fit and 50s' group has \$109.

The Barossa Council finance reports were emailed to MP Progress Inc. members.

Noted that all 3 cost centres are favourable.

Sub Committee reports:

Talunga Park:

Noted that the increased watering has greatly improved the amenity of the oval.

The wooden animals are to be re-painted and re-positioned following the removal of the pine trees and it was suggested that some be placed on low level plinths to prevent rotting and to enable easy access for maintenance.

MOVED: Di Anderson, SECONDED: Pete Stephens that the Men's Shed write to the Progress Association seeking funds to do so. CARRIED.

Soldiers' Memorial Hall:

- The issue of flooding has been addressed by TBC with the installation of wider diameter downpipes.
- Junkens Builders and representatives from TBC and the Progress association met to discuss replacement of the stairs at either side of the stage. This work will be completed in June 2021 (to avoid disruption during History Month and to the TOTT Theatre production).

The Community Dinner:

The Community Dinner was held at 6pm on Sunday evening, February 28th, with 46 in attendance. There will only be 4 dinners this year.

Barossa Councillor Discussions:

Talunga Park redevelopment

The Barossa Council was recently successful in obtaining a Local Government Infrastructure Partnership Programme grant to the amount of \$817,286.00 to undertake major upgrades to the Mount Pleasant Caravan Park. Council will add just over \$1.2 million to the grant for an all-up expenditure of just over \$2.0 million. The project will deliver 2 x 2-bed cabins (Phase 1), 24 powered caravan pitches, a new camp kitchen, visitor amenities and all associated reception, maintenance, service/utility and civil infrastructure upgrades. This redevelopment forms part of The Barossa Council 'The Big Project'.

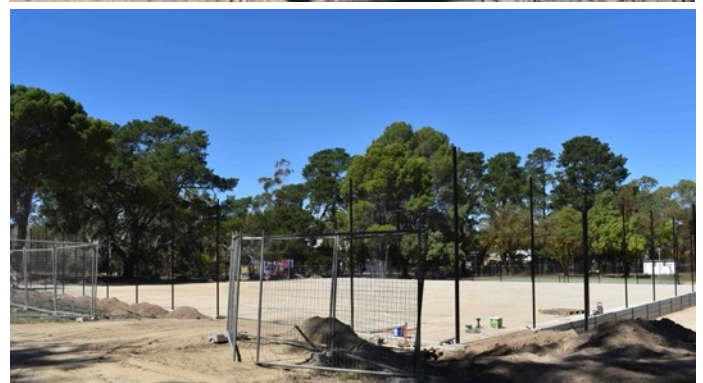

I liked hammering the nails. I have been able to get them straighter and straighter each time that I have done it. From Logan

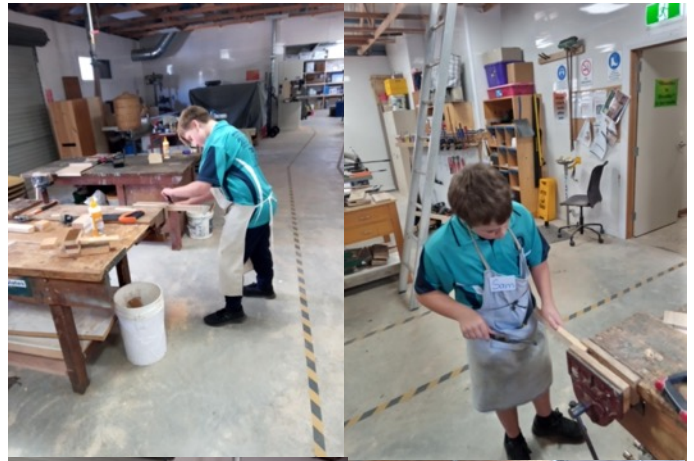
I like sawing the wood using a hand saw. I am left-handed and I have learnt how to use my right hand to saw. From Levi

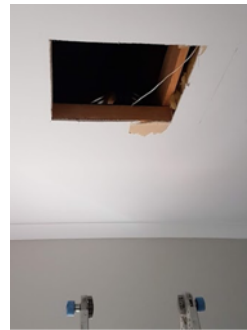

A BIG thanks to John Bowd for creating a manhole so we can now finally go ahead and get electrical quotes. The work here requires wires checked from the road to the building and within, replacing internal lights, installing a smoke and CO2 detector, outside power point, security lights and electric oven. Quotes are being obtained.

The end window overlooking the tennis courts needs carpentry work and training has been offered to rebuild it.

A Pump to service the kitchen sink and toilets has been organised and will be installed soon.

We need some landscaping done to move watershed away from the building. It was suggested we move the drive way about 10m up to road away from the building. Other landscaping jobs include levelling a walkway past the back of the building towards the courts, using the large rocks on the property as a border, creating a designated area for the outside fire and a larger area around it. Quotes are being obtained.



The Mount Pleasant Men's Shed will tidy up trees and remove any dead wood over the whole property during winter.

Some carpet rugs have been donated, as well as some kitchen cabinets, but they will need a bit of work.

Items for possible working bees:

- Holes in the gyprock need fixing, plus sanding and painting.
- The Wooden shelter also has loose and missing timbers, and there are windows missing.
- Outside timber facias need replacing and painting, and we need someone who has expertise in this area to finish this.
- A ramp into the building for easier wheelchair and stroller access is required.
- The Toilet building has loose and missing timbers.
- Posts have been offered for replacing fencing.
- Courts need debris cleaned off and we are hoping Correctional Services can bring a team up to do this, but if they can't, we'll need to add that to a working bee.

If we can save money on some of the jobs above it was suggested we purchase a second water tank. Can you help with any of this? It's important that we get moving and have the money committed that the Barossa Council budgeted by
