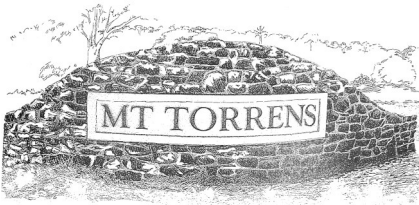

### Mt Torrens Centenary Park

**Welcome and Thank You:** We welcome Paul De Salis to the Park Committee and recognise the generosity of the De Salis family in making a considerable donation in memory of Paul's brother Peter. The donation will be used for improvement of the facility. Thank you Paul!

**Funding and Oval Maintenance:** The Adelaide Hills Council is introducing a new policy across council and community owned facilities. The Park Committee had a preliminary meeting with AHC staff who outlined their proposal and listened to our concerns. While the council offers to take on maintenance of the playing surface to a community standard (potentially less than the standard our volunteers provide currently) they would cease to fund any additional work to meet the standards required by sporting clubs. We can opt out of their proposal and funding would be available, but every dollar would have to be acquitted against specified oval maintenance requirements. Some flexibility self managed community owned facilities previously enjoyed in practice would disappear. It is expected that AHC will offer to cut, fertilise, aerate, spray and top dress the playing surface with the manual watering of the oval remaining the responsibility of the Park Committee. We are still waiting on their proposal. Whatever happens we have a big decision to make.

**Dogs at the Park:** We recognise that many of you love taking your dog for a walk including on and around the oval. As a friendly reminder; **all dogs must be on a leash at all times when using the Centenary Park, including the oval and surrounds.** While you love your dog and trust it, not everyone feels this way about dogs, so please respect other users and our requirement that dogs must be on a leash. And if your dog does the inevitable, bags are provided at the main entry gate to assist in the clean-up and disposal of dog droppings.

### Hello Mount Torrens

(Formerly Underground Power Lines Project)

There have been a few things happening in our committee. Firstly, there has been a name change. We are now called "Hello Mount Torrens". Our logo is the General Store and Post Office - we thought as it was the hub of Mount Torrens, the place where the community goes to pick up their mail or buy some milk or the paper. It is the place where people say hello. There has been a lot happening in regards to the power lines. As you may have recently seen in the Courier, the Adelaide Hills Council is at least now considering us to have our powerlines underground. However, they have not given any timeline for when they will be done. The creek on Townsend Street has also been cleaned. As Mount Torrens is a State Heritage Area, we are pushing for the Council to make us a priority to have the power lines underground. For too long Mount Torrens has been overlooked in regards to just having basic maintenance attended to, never mind being looked after like a State Heritage Area should be. It doesn't mean turning us into another Hahndorf, it just means that things such as the power lines have to be underground. It is certainly going to be a long process but we are confident that we will achieve this. As they say "How do you eat an elephant? One bite at a time" There is a lot of to and fro-ing with talking to Council and various other stake holders. Unfortunately, it's not very glamorous and it looks as though nothing is happening but it is. A big shout out to Malcolm Herrmann, our Valleys Ward Councillor, for being such a great advocate for our cause. Please feel free to contact us if anyone has any ideas or skills that may help us achieve the undergrounding of the power lines and the beautification of Townsend Street. A community meeting is certainly in the pipeline.

### Adelaide Hills Council

- 1) Following strong community support, Council approved the planting of a native tree on Federation Park Gumeracha to commemorate the coronation of King Charles III.
- 2) Council approved a program for undergrounding powerlines, giving priority to completion on Main Street Lobethal, followed by Mount Torrens and Woodside. Note that these are long term projects and subject to approval of the Powerlines Environment Committee (PLEC)
- 3) Council has committed funding in the forward estimates towards the extension of the Amy Gillet Bikeway to Birdwood. The Federal Government funding has been secured also. However, the state government is still to commit to its share to ensure the project proceeds.
- 4) Library hours are being varied as from 1 July. Refer to the council website for details. Woodside hours have been reduced from 47 to 43 and Gumeracha staffed hours remain unchanged at 18 per week
- 5) The Annual Business Plan (ABP) including the budget was released for public consultation on 12 May. The Plan ensures that council meets its three key financial sustainability ratios. Capital expenditure is \$17.9m, operating income \$56.6m, Operating expenditure \$ 55.3m generating a surplus \$1.3m, projected borrowings \$23.1m at 30 June 2024. The estimated average residential rate rise is 6.9%, just under the CPI. The Landscape Levy collected by council and transferred to the State Government will rise by 47%.
- 6) The public toilets near the Coach House are awaiting development approval. You can check progress by phoning the council 8408 0400 and quoting the DA No. 23010660. Construction will follow the completion of the refurbishment of the Federation Park Toilets at Gumeracha and should commence in July. *Maybe residents of Mount Torrens could plant a tree as well !!*

### New Springs Landcare Group

Well, the grass is a little greener than 2 months ago when I wrote for the last newsletter. However, I'd say we still haven't had a real break for the season. Where is that 50mls of rain over a couple of days? But if you are like our home, the fire is now burning 24/7 as average daily temperature drops.

As promised, here is the link to the New Springs Weather Station on Warmington Run.

<https://www.awsnetwork.com.au/> From the big list, just type in Harrogate and you'll be on to it. Set Harrogate as your primary station and next time you look it'll come up straightaway. It tells you windspeed, maximum windspeed, minimum windspeed, wind direction, air temperature, soil temperature and dew point, humidity, rainfall since 9 am and rainfall in the last 15 minutes. All pretty handy stuff. We are proud as a new group to be offered the weather station and we encourage you to use it.

There are two pictures with this article. One is a group of people at the dam workshop and field day at the end of March. Some 55 people came on the sunny morning. Kim Thompson spoke on planting around the dam, and particularly planting sedges and reeds. Mike Keogh spoke on cleaning out silt and mud from the dam. Blokes from the Landscape Board spoke on low flow bypasses, in particular the new siphon style. Wally Guthrie built a number of demonstration fences covering the pros and cons of traditional fences as opposed to electric. The second picture is of the fence that we built around our dam using concreted in railway iron strainers and Waratah Maxi posts and Jio droppers and clips. Also featuring no barbed wire. We'll see how that goes!

A most successful dinner at Mt Torrens Hotel was held on April 4. Members from Mid Torrens Catchment Group, Upper Torrens Landcare and New Springs Landcare all sharing stories of their groups and projects. We hope to work somewhat collaboratively in the future, each bringing different skills and knowledge to the table. We haven't worked out exactly what we'll do yet as this really was a chance to meet and greet. Of course, our special guest, newly appointed State Landcare Co-ordinator, Natalia Diaz, also had an opportunity to speak about her new role. We hope to see a lot more of Natalia as our groups develop. ### Mt Torrens Community Table in the Community Garden



Have you wandered through Dunnfield recently and seen the very large mosaic table? I'd like to tell you the story behind it. In October 2020, Mt Torrens resident artist, Robby Towill, was approached to come up with a design to do a table for the proposed community garden. The Dunnfield group, a sub-committee of the Mt Torrens District Community Association were applying for some funding and this started the ball rolling. The brief was open except that the wording "Meet here to connect" had to be on the table. The design was made originally for a 900mm in diameter size table, with a small edge for the community to do. Robby took inspiration from the community plantings, animals seen, or believed to finally settle in the area once the landscape was finished. The table was intended to be a point of meeting; either to swap seeds, stories, have a chat, or a picnic while at the Community Gardens in Dunnfield. A round table, to symbolise and promote equality of involvement and inclusiveness.

The centre of the table represents our larger animals, the brush tailed possum, koala and a boo book owl, in and on a gum tree. A red-belly black and eastern-brown snake surround the circle and meet up with the words "Meet here to connect". The second circle is cut up into eight pie sections. In those pie sections are a Murray magpie, Gum flowers, Indian duck, Blue Flax Lilly, Blue wrens, Grevillea, Wood duck and Beaked hakea.

The centre was completed by Robby Towill and the edge would be completed by the community with Robby pulling it all together. The middle of the table was started in July 2021 and was finished January 2022. Work didn't start until we had a table and we're grateful to the Hoppo family here in Mt Torrens for their donation. They donated a much bigger table than originally designed for and so a new plan was hatched for the community edge of the table. Instead of a small 10 x 10cm mosaic, it now grew to a series of different sizes, which started from a 15cm circle, to a 20cm circle and finally a 25cm circle. People could choose which size they wanted to tackle. In May 2021 there was a meeting in Dunnfield, open to all community members to attend and offer ideas for the playground areas, the picnic areas and the Community Garden. The table, with centre completed, was taken along to show community members, with a couple of example circles in place, and to take down names of people who wanted to be involvement in mosaicing the outer edge. There was a delay in doing the edge while Covid numbers



fluctuated and people were getting immunised but weekend workshops started February 2023. Thirteen community members attended workshops held at Bee Happy Art Studio, in Mt Torrens and created a circle containing an animal or a plant they love, that is in the Hills. It was fabulous to have people working together for a common cause and all getting a new skill under their belt, as well as meeting new people and making friends. Robby Towill and Sheryl Collins did extra larger circles to fill in the gaps, as some people couldn't make it to the workshops, and then they cut out hundreds of smaller circles to fill in-between all the circles people had finished. Once they were all stuck down the already grouted areas had to be masked off, the final grout colour was done. This job took 4 days. Then it was ready to be delivered and installed in the garden. The table was installed on 16<sup>th</sup> April 2023. This project was a huge community effort and many people were involved in making it possible so I'd like to take this opportunity to give them the credit they deserve. Thank you to:-
