

Tungkillo Ghost Moth and Grub

"Look! High above the swirling white winter mists rise huge mountains covered with dark stringybark trees. In summer night bushfires sometimes crackle and glow among the branches. This is the former Tungkillo homeland of the People Of The Adelaide Hills by Reg Butler Peramangk people"



The caterpillars of this species are white with a brown head and dark spiracies. The caterpillars are a favoured bait for fishing. They live in vertical tunnels in the ground, which they dig and cap with a hinged lid. The caterpillars feed on the roots of Gum and Wattle Trees.

The caterpillars ringbark the roots an the plant responds by growing gall like tissue on the underground root, upon which the caterpillars then feed. The caterpillars pupae at the bottom of their tunnel. Which is silk lined, vertical subteranean shaft 63 - 75 in depth and leading to within a few millimetres of the surface. The pupa can have length of up to 8 cms



The adult moths are grey brown with flashes and other more complex markings on the forewings. The hindwings are brown fading to pale brown at the margins. The males are usually smaller than the females and have more prominent markings. Apparently this species only apprears in SA on the first warm wet night in april when the males are attracted to lights and may be captured with ease. When matamorphasis is complete, the pupa squirms up to the top of its tunnel. The plug of earth closing the chamber is lifted like a hinged lid when the pupa thrusts half of its length out of hole during emergence.

As part of a Mid-Murray Council Program to offer opportunities for its citizens to express their towns unique identity and dream, a grant was provided. This was to specifically employ an artist to help clarify the vision for how Tungkillo's identity may be creatively

Tungkillo Progress Club commissioned local artist Malcolm Reynolds to develop the Moth Sculpture. The Sculpture represents the Moth arising out of a tree and the grub emerging from the ground.

Tungkillo Township

Tungkillo Township

Tungkillo was originally the name of a mine located south of
Palmer, which opened in 1847. In 1848, a town was surveyed
at the mine.
The present-day town was settled by Samuel Patten in 1861,
who called it South Petherton (after the Somerset town of
South Petherton from which his family originated). The name
of South Petherton was officially altered on 24 January 1906 to
Tungkillo, although the two names were used interchangeably
see late as 1936.

Tungkillo is a corruption of tainkila, a Peramangk Aboriginal word meaning ghost moth grubs.



Long before the dawn of modern white history, the Peramangk Aboriginal people inhabited the tree filled guilles and park like tablelands of the eastern Adelaide Hills. These folk enjoyed unending supply of edible plants and grubs to gather together with marsupials such as kangaroos and opossums to hunt. By the time of first white colonists made their way into the Adelaide Hills in 1837 the Peramangk had all but disappeared, leaving great silent forests for Europeans to explore and eventually clear. Remanants of Aboriginal rock paintings and creek side camps, together with strategic look-out caves peering over the Murray Flats, remind later generations of this significant era.

The caterpillar of the moth grub was a right royal delicacy for the Peramangk. Food gatherers became experts at flushing out the 8cm-10cm long hulls of cream flesh form decaying gum trees.
Tungkillo's prolific wattles proved another rich source of moth larvae.
Further spring time treats included white ant and other insect larvae, birds' eggs, young birds and lizards. During summer the tribe sought out native roots and vegetable products.

Also know and the Emu apple, Native cranberries or Munthali.

This berry is a highly valued fruit by the Aboriginal peoples, is significantly higher in antioxidants than blueberries and also quite high levels of Vitamin C. Fruit was dried and pounded down to make into cake and traded among the clans

The name "Muntries" was first recorded in 1840 and is one of the 400 Aboriginal words adopted by the settlers into the Australian English languages from the Kaurna and Ngarrindjeri language of Eastern South Australia.

In the wild, Muntrie berries are found to grow from Eyre Peninsula and Kangaroo Island South Australia down the SA coast line and into Portland Victoria.

Muntries are a ground hugging native plant with the branches spreading up to 3 meters in the wild but under cultivation grow very successfully on trellised and this makes them easier to harvest. Muntries grow best in well-drained soil requiring moderate to strong alkaline PH 6.0 - 8.0. These plants when established can tolerate dry conditions, are frost tolerant and tolerate extreme temperatures. With satisfactory watering they will produce a healthy amount of fruit. This plant does not like to be water logged. It may take 2 to 3 years before the plant is in full swing and produces an abundance of fruit. When flowering the plant produces a lovely cluster of white flowers which the bees

love also. Berries will need to be netted if you don't wish to share with the local bird life. The ripe fruit is the size of one's thumb nall or smaller, it is a green berry with a reddish tinge forming on the berry. Grows in cluster and ripens around Feb- March. Muntries have a lovely appley cinnamon flavor. A good time to harvest in the Tungkillo area is around mid-March. I usually harvest on Mt Pleasant Show Day.

Fruit can be eaten fresh, dried, or frozen however when removed from freezer will be soft when thawed. Freeze up to 24 months. Freezing for no more than 24 months actually helps retain this super food nutritional values. Berries can be used anywhere that you would use sultanas' examples, sweet ples(apple), chutneys, salads, cakes and sauces. Use instead of sultanas in a rice salad.

Rice salad with Muntrie Berries and homemade French dressing

1 cup of rice

4 green onions finely chapped

1 medium capsicum finely chopped 310g can corn, drained

450g can pineapple pieces, drained 1/3 cup of muntrie berries

Cook rice, when rice is cooled down add all ingredients together and mix well

French dressing

1/3 cup veg oil

¼ teaspoon sugar

1/4 tbs mustard powder.

2tbs white vinegar or lemon juice

Place all ingredients in a jar screw lid and shake








I personally love using it in cooking. Culinary Essential oils only.


