

She has worked tirelessly in the role as Market Manager from inception right through to the present day.

Genevieve said, "The last 10 years as Manager of the Mt Pleasant Farmers Market have been an extraordinary experience where I have been able to use my previous experience in management to assemble a team of individuals, both paid and voluntary, to develop what has become an integral event in the Mt Pleasant calendar and is a state and nationally recognised authentic Farmers Market."

"I acknowledge the inspiration and initial work of the Volunteers of the Mt Pleasant Natural Resource Centre under the guidance of Faye McGoldrick, whose enthusiasm was the original impetus for the project."

Chelsea said, "The value and commitment of current manager, Genevieve to the market is overwhelming but I am very excited to take on the challenge and have lots of ideas to help enhance the already successful market."

A full calendar of events is planned for the 10th birthday celebrations. One of the markets favourite son's, celebrity chef Simon Bryant, will be returning to the market to celebrate. Simon will be cooking up a storm with market produce, with his usual flair & style. Simon said, "I am humbled that the Market Board has considered me to be part of the celebrations".

A gala dinner event will also be held in Mt Pleasant to announce and present market stalwarts & life members with awards. Event organiser, Terese Stephens said "The event will host and reunited the many stall holders, volunteers, members and staff that have been involved with the community not-for-profit group over the past ten years."
