### Barossa invests further in recreation and sporting assets

The Barossa Council has endorsed the extension of the oval at Tanunda Recreation Park at a Special Council meeting held on 26 October.

The oval will be lengthened from an existing 160 metres to 171 metres.

The investment coincides with the current renewal of the oval, which is well advanced after Belair Turf was appointed the successful tenderer in August.

Council said there is no better time to do this work than now while contractors are on site, describing it as the most efficient and cost-effective way to deliver these improved service levels.

The extension of the oval is a long-term investment and will make Tanunda Oval comparable to similar sized grounds in the Barossa and the main oval planned for Lyndoch.

In endorsing the plan, Council stated "this is an investment in our future generations, irrespective of any prospect of national or state sporting games."

The long-term investment responds to local, regional and State aspirations, and will deliver improved community recreation and sporting assets as well as economic event and tourism opportunities.

The investment of \$303,000 – the equivalent of \$10,100 a year for the life of the asset – will commence immediately and includes extension of the playing surface, irrigation, fencing, tree removal and associated changes to parking and viewing mounds.

The project does not impact other works already planned in Council's 2023-24 budget.

Council will also review the tree replanting program in conjunction with the Tanunda Recreation Park advisory committee and previous landscaping community group. This will identify further opportunities to replant trees as outlined in the original masterplan for the site, now that the majority of works in the plan are complete or near completion.

The tree replanting program review and stakeholder engagement will be prioritised and completed as soon as possible.

The oval extension will be ready for recreational and sporting use as early as possible in 2024.

## Williamstown & Districts Historical Society

#### The old Swimming Pool

The large pond of water in Victoria Creek referred to by locals as the Duck Pond or by the old locals as the Old Swimming Pool has a colorful history, in fact the area holds an important part in the history and development of the town of Williamstown. The Pond however was the dream and vision of one man – William Sylvester Dyer, and the hard work of the local Community. The locals rolled up their sleeves and the first Williamstown Swimming Pool came into being.

William Dyer, created the first small pool next to what the locals call Cundy's Bridge, by sandbagging the creek in 1931. However the winter rains of 1932 washed the bags down the creek. So not discouraged he sandbagged further down the creek and made a larger pool. However the writing was on the wall, the next big flood would carry it all away.

William Dyer began canvassing for donations to build a more permanent wall with concrete. Stewart Hammett in his "Back Home to Williamstown" states that in 1933 several public meetings were held and a Swimming Pool Committee was formed. Leading lights of the day became involved, GKG Warren President, A Kelley, P Buckley, F Adams, C Johnson, PC Wilson, JA Woods, A J Springbett and S Wilson. They were a successful group and the wall was built at the cost of £52. Membership was 5/- a year and children 1/-.

Then the work began with many of the local people donating their time and their equipment and horses. Boulders were manually carried out and the horses used to operate scoops to clear the bottom. The rock floor was blasted to make a ditch to pour the wall into. Mr Warren is credited for designing and the building of the sluice gate mechanism. He is also credited with covering most of the cost.

Later a wooden diving tower was added and then this was replaced by a windmill tower of steel construction. Given the fearful stories that are told it is amazing that no one ever drowned.

The first "Learn to swim " classes were held at the old pool. Leeches were numerous. The water cold and murky, but what fun.

To quote a few of these exploits:

A cable was strung across from bank to bank and a bike with the tyres removed was ridden across on the cable. Some made it, many didn't.

Guss Fromm used to plant a huge water melon on the bottom of the deep end and challenge the lads to get it up. The reward – the melon of course.

Graham Chudleigh dived from the top of the tower but his false teeth beat him into the water. They are still there if you are interested.

There are numerous stories, most of the old locals can probably tell one. So next time you stop and look at the old duck pond, stop and listen, you might just hear the children's shrieks and laughter as they bomb each other from the side of the pool.
